INTRODUCTION

Between January 22 and 29, 2016, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ), Houston Regional Office, received 26 odor complaints by phone and e-mail, including 6 from anonymous complainants. These 26 odor complaints were assigned to TCEQ incident #226854.

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The complainants alleged that an odor of an unpleasant nature has been occurring in the area. The TCEQ has been receiving recent complaints regarding odor in this area since August 2015, and the duration and frequency has varied. For incident #226854, the majority of the complainants alleged the odors came from Akzo Nobel Surface Chemistry (Akzo) located at 15200 Almeda Rd, Houston, Texas, and Blue Ridge Landfill (BRL) located at 2200 FM 521, Fresno, Texas.

The ranges of meteorological conditions over the 4 different days of complaint incidents are described below. All data was taken from the Weather Underground, Shadow Creek Ranch station (KTXPEARL23). The temperatures ranged from 46 °F to 56 °F, cloud cover was clear, wind speed varied from 2 to 6 miles per hour (mph), and winds coming from the southwest and northwest prevailed.

All complainants were contacted via telephone and e-mail by Ms. Alejandra De Los Santos on February 1, 2016 between 3:00 PM and 5:00 PM. General information relating to these complaints is listed below.

The investigator asked the complainants for a detailed description of the odor. The alleged odor was described in a variety of ways such as putrid, rotting garbage, trash, sewage, chemical-like, ammonia, stinky, sulfurous and rotten eggs. The odor descriptions varied between complainants, some of which stated that it was or was not a particular odor. For example, a complainant stated that the odor smelled like urine on January 23, 2016 at 8:00 AM, while another complainant stated that the odor smelled like petroleum on January 23, 2016 at 12:05 AM. Some complainants stated that the odors were much stronger near Blue Ridge Landfill.

Several complainants expressed concerns about the odor possibly being toxic to their health and alleged health effects such as headaches, nausea, and nose and throat pain. In addition to the health effects, some complainants alleged discomfort for not being able to go or stay outside on their property and some mentioned that the odor remained inside the residences after it had dissipated outside.

Investigation Narrative

On February 5, 2016, investigators, Ms. Alejandra De Los Santos, Ms. Ilana Hairston and Mr. John Bregger, arrived in the vicinity of the complaint location on Almeda Road at 7:43 AM. The investigators drove north on Almeda Road to survey the area next to BRL (See Attachment 1 - Survey Route Map). While driving, the investigators noted an odor, which was similar to garbage and crude oil.

At 7:57 AM, the investigators parked along Almeda Road approximately 1.2 miles south of the intersection of Almeda Road and Shadow Creek Parkway (Attachment 1 - Location A). The surrounding land use in this area is mainly residential, some industrial, and is predominantly flat terrain with trees and houses along Almeda Road. This location is due east of BRL.

At 7:58 AM, the investigators began recording the odor observations utilizing the Investigator's Odor Intensity Time Log (See Attachment 2 - Investigators' Odor Logs). The temperature during the odor survey was 47 °F, cloud cover was clear, wind speed of 2 miles per hour (mph), and winds coming from the east south east. Data was taken from the Weather Underground, Shadow Creek Ranch station (Station ID: KTXPEARL23). The odor again smelled like crude oil and garbage/trash. The intensity of the odor was very strong during the first minutes of the odor survey, but the intensity decayed rapidly within minutes until the investigators were no longer able to detect any odors. The odor was determined to be offensive according to the TCEQ Frequency, Intensity, Duration, and Offensiveness (FIDO) protocol.

At 8:09 AM, the investigators drove approximately 3 miles south of the previous location and continued the odor survey (Attachment 1 - Location B). At this time, the odor intensity varied from moderate to very light. The smell of crude oil predominated at the time. By 8:19 AM, the odor intensity was very light.

At 8:27 AM, the investigators drove south of the intersection of Almeda Road and West Broadway Street (Attachment 1 - Location C). The investigators were unable to detect an odor at this location.

At 8:35 AM, the investigators then drove along Kentucky Road (Attachment 1 - Location D) and Nail Road (Attachment 1 - Location E), south of BRL, but were unable to detect an odor.

Around 8:45 AM, the investigators began driving throughout the Shadow Creek Ranch neighborhood stopping at Green Thicket Drive (Attachment 1 - Location F), Leafwood Lane (Attachment 1 - Location G), Longlake Drive

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(Attachment 1 - Location H), Mountain Sage Drive (Attachment 1 - Location I), Morgan Bay Drive (Attachment 1 - Location J) and Sorrel Ridge Court (Attachment 1 - Location K). The investigators were unable to detect an odor at any of these locations.

Based on this investigation, the actual source of the alleged odors was not confirmed. The investigation concluded at 10:10 AM.

Facility Authorization Narrative

As the actual source of the alleged odors was not confirmed, a facility authorization was not evaluated during this investigation.

Exit Interview

An exit interview form was not completed since there were no alleged violations, additional issues, or records requested.

Conclusions, Recommendations, and Current Enforcement Actions

Based on this investigation, no violations are being alleged. The Frequency, Intensity, Duration and Offensiveness (FIDO) chart categorizes the landfill garbage/waste odor as offensive. In order to confirm a nuisance, an offensive odor has to last 4 hours with a very strong (VS) intensity as a single occurrence. Since the odor did not have a VS intensity and did not last 4 hours, the single occurrence documented during this investigation does not constitute a nuisance based on the TCEQ FIDO protocol.

Additional Issues

No additional issues were noted during this investigation.
