EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

BACKGROUND

Annually, as part of the budget process, City staff makes necessary additions and/or changes in fees in order to cover the cost of service being provided as well as conduct a rate analysis as part of the water/sewer rate model.

Fee changes have been discussed as part of the budget process in budget workshops held in August and September. Pursuant to Council feedback on September 12, 2016, staff will present two options for council consideration.

The changes to the fees for fiscal year 2017 include:

1. Change to the water and sewer rate structure by which transition to base charge is scaled up by meter size on both the water and sewer side along with an increase to volumetric rates.

SCHEDULE

The first and only reading of the Non-Development Fee Ordinance is on September 19, 2016. Fees will go into effect October 1, 2016 and implemented in City of Pearland October 1, 2016 and the ETJ 60 days after notice.

POLICY/GOAL CONSIDERATION

Amending the fee schedule is in accordance with the City's Financial Management Policy Statements – Revenues. Policy Statements include: Design, maintain, and administer a revenue system that will assure reliable, equitable, diversified, and a sufficient revenue stream to support desired City services, and, For services that benefit specific users, the City shall establish and collect fees to recover the costs of those services. At a minimum, the City shall strive to cover the direct costs.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Consideration and approval of Ordinance 1358-14 amending non-development usage and service fees; containing a savings clause, a severability clause and a repealer clause; providing for publication and an effective date.

ORDINANCE NO. 1358-14

An Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Pearland, Texas, amending non-development usage and service fees; containing a savings clause, a severability clause, a repealer clause, declaring an emergency; providing for publication and an effective date.

WHEREAS, various departments of the City charge fees for usage, permits, and

other services not related to development; and

WHEREAS, the organization of all such non-development fees into one ordinance enhances the efficiency of the fee amendment process and improves customer service; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PEARLAND, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the charges and fees contained in the attached Exhibit "A" are hereby adopted.

<u>Section 2</u>. Savings. All rights and remedies which have accrued in favor of the City under this Chapter and amendments thereto shall be and are preserved for the benefit of the City.

<u>Section 3</u>. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

<u>Section 4</u>. Repealer. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed but only to the extent of such conflict.

ORDINANCE NO. 1358-14

<u>Section 5.</u> Emergency. Declaration of Emergency. The Council finds and determines that adopting non-development fees inures to the benefit of the public and, therefore, bears directly upon the health, safety and welfare of the citizenry; and that this ordinance shall be adopted as an emergency measure, and that the rule requiring this ordinance to be read on two (2) separate occasions be, and the same is hereby waived.

<u>Section 6</u>. Publication and Effective Date. The City Secretary shall cause this Ordinance, or its caption, to be published in the official newspaper of the City of Pearland, upon passage of such Ordinance. The Ordinance shall then become effective ten (10) days from and after its publication, or the publication of its caption, in the official City newspaper.

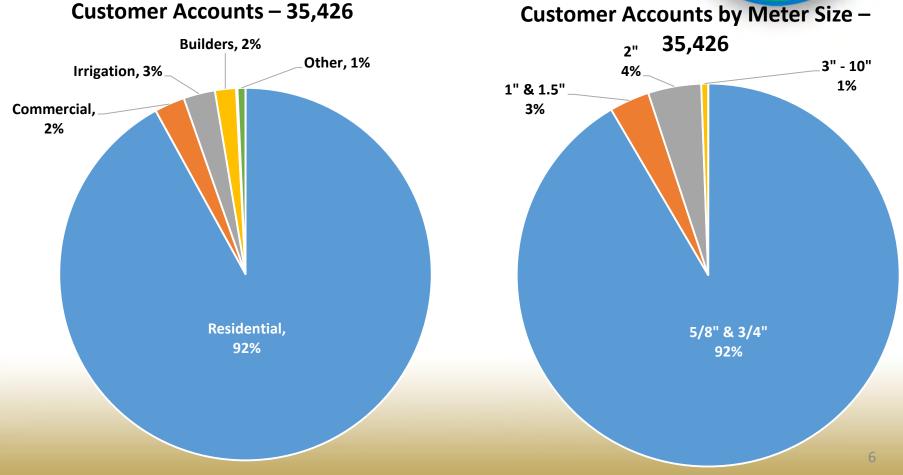

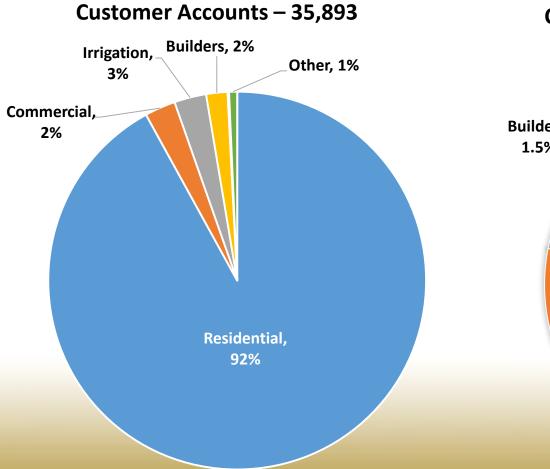
Water-Sewer Customer Profile



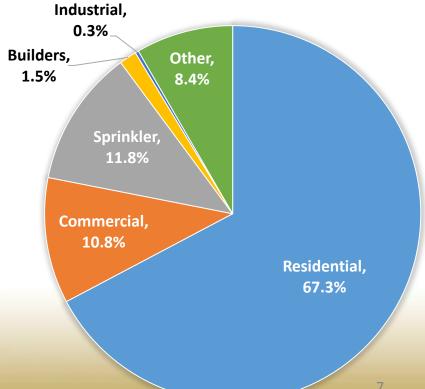

Old Rate Structure

- Single amount for base rate for all residential and commercial meters
- Base rates not tied to meter capacity
- Not reflective of larger meter impacts on system capacity

New Rate Structure

- Base rates calculated on volumetric capacity of the meter
- Revises cost allocation to base charge
- More prevalent industry practice; AWWA capacity factors

Options



Option 1 – Consensus from Raftelis presentation on 8/29/2016

- Scenarios SCW1 & SCWW1
- Revised cost allocation to base charge and transition to base charge scaled up by meter size
- Multi-family base rate is 91% of 5/8" meter base rate

Option 2 – Similar to option 1

- revised the multiplier to make 5/8" and 3/4" meters equal, then scaled up for larger meters
- Held water base rate for 5/8" and 3/4" meters to 2016 rate (\$13.78)
- Increased the multi-family base rate to equal the 5/8" and 3/4" rate

Additional Option Considered - Not Shown

- Hold constant a 6,000 gallon residential customer to \$64.87
- Model results were skewed. In order to force the above rate, all sewer costs moved to base costs resulting in some bills increasing significantly and others decreasing significantly, instead of a shared increase.
- Difficult to justify to rate payers

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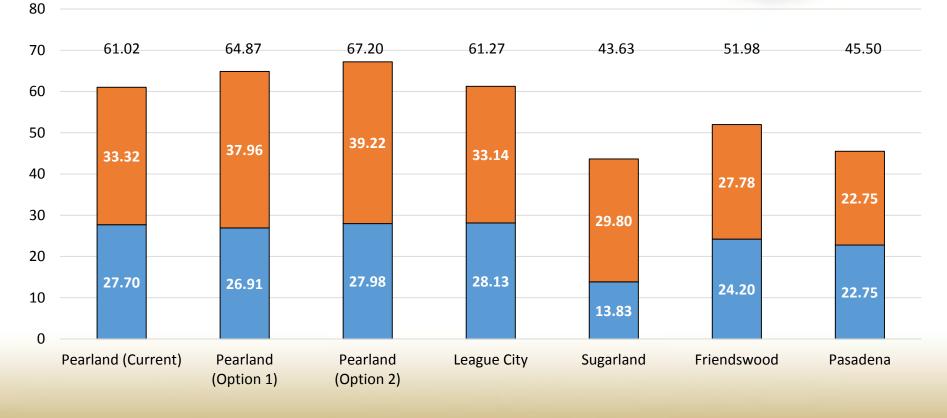
Waste Water Volumetric Charges

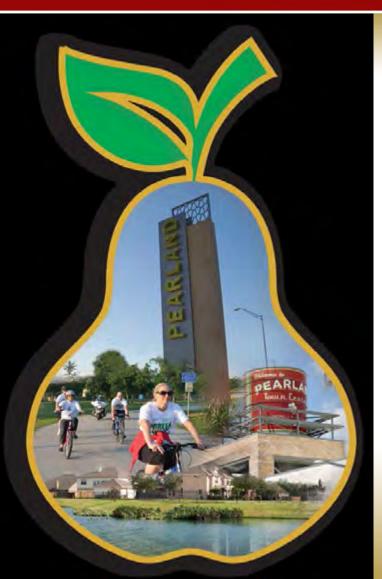
