







Court/PD Make Move to New Cullen Pkwy, Facility

unicipal Court and the Pearland Police Dept. permanently moved in April to the new Public Safety Building (PSB), located at 2555 Cullen Parkway (77581), from their respective locations at City Hall and Veterans Dr. A Utility Billing 'satellite' office is also housed at the Cullen location, and the Brazoria County Tax Office is scheduled for future relocation to the 2nd floor of the new facility from the old location at the Community Center on Liberty Dr.

Along with the police station, court facilities, utility billing annex, and county annex, the 79,800 square foot PSB facility houses a state-of-the-art Emergency Operations Center (EOC), with the entire facility built to withstand Category 5 hurricane-force winds. The project was funded by Certificates of Obligation in 2007. Supplemental funding in 2009 represents \$200,000 for a phone system and \$250,000 to equip the Emergency Operations Center (EOC).

City Council held an April 26 regular meeting at the Public Safety Building instead of the usual location at City Hall, one of several planned 'off-site' to occasionally bring future meetings closer to residents on the west end of town.

"The Police Department will now have dedicated meeting and training facilities that will enable us to serve as a regional law enforcement training provider", said Police Chief J.C. Doyle. Renovation plans Continued on Page 3 . . .

Police Honor Guard Selected for DC Memorial

he Pearland Police Department Honor Guard was selected to participate in ceremonies at the National Peace Officer Memorial in Washington D.C. during the week of May 11th through the 16th. Peace Officers from the United States and as far away as Canada and the United Kingdom travel to Washington D.C. to recognize the men and women of law enforcement who have been killed in the line of duty. This period during the month of May is known as "Police Week" and includes May 15th which President John F.

Kennedy signed into law on October 1st 1962 as National Peace Officer Memorial Day.

National Peace Officer Memorial Day honors the men and women of law enforcement who have been killed or disabled in the line of duty. Flags are flown at half staff. Names of the fallen officers are etched into the panels of the national memorial in Washington D.C. the week leading up to the annual ceremonies. The national memorial is the central location where the majority of the events take place during "Police Week."



The City Of Pearland is one of only four cities in Texas selected for the 2010 events and this is the third year the Pearland Police Department Honor Guard will attend. Selection for participation is limited and often the Honor Guards requesting assign-

ments far exceed spots available. Eight Honor Guard members participated and attendance at the events could not have been possible without the assistance from community organizations and local businesses. Honor Guard Members practice and participate in events such as these during "Police Week" in addition to their regular duties as Police Officers. "I feel that it is important to be a part of the Pearland Police Department Honor Guard be-

cause it allows me to show my support to the families and other Law Enforcement Agencies during the difficult times when we lose one of our own. It is also an honor to represent the Police Department and the City of Pearland during ceremonies and festive events," stated Honor Guard member J. Cox.

Pearland has not been excluded from in the line of duty deaths. On October 6th, 1967 Officer Henry Wendell Jr. was

killed after being struck by a vehicle while directing traffic after a football game. On May 16th, 1973 James Cassidy Jr. was killed in a motor vehicle accident. The names of both Wendell and

Cassidy are etched in the Peace Officer Memorial panels in Washington D.C. In addition to events

New EOC in Place for 2010 Hurricane Threats

he new, state-of-the-art Emergency Operations Center (EOC) is complete and ready to go in the event of city-wide emergencies or disasters. Housed in the recently completed, 79,000 square-foot Public Safety Building, the EOC - and the PSB - were built to withstand Category 5 hurricane-force winds.

This time last year, several City departments and employees displaced by Ike damage to City Hall in Oc-

tober 2008 were moving back to that location from their temporary digs at various locations around town.

Ironically, the opening of the new EOC and PSB is just in time for the June 1 - November 30, 2010 hurricane season, so now is the time to prepare.

In the event of a major storm, or any type of emergency situation, Pearland residents will be supplied all pertinent local information on radio station 740 KTRH AM, via the City website at www.cityofpearland.com, and local network TV stations. If needed, a Point-Of-Distribution (POD) will be immediately put into place at a to-be-determined location to afford residents a source of supplies and information.

In the event of a voluntary or mandatory evacuation, residents may evacuate to any city they choose. Brazoria County residents that lack other accommodations, such as hotel reservations or being able to stay with family or friends, have been assigned to the Texas Expo Center, 301 West Loop 121 in Belton. Those who choose to stay during a voluntary evacuation are faced with no official emergency shelters in Pearland, nor will emergency crews be available during a storm's high winds. The Red Cross can't open shelters until after a storm.

Residents with special health care or transportation needs (including those who are disabled or medically fragile) that do not have a car or other vehicle, and cannot get a ride with friends, neighbors, or family should register for a ride now by dialing 2-1-1. This service is for people who cannot drive themselves or make trans-

> 901 TX have been designated

as evacuation 'hubs' or meeting centers in the event of evacuation for "special needs" persons. Call 281-652-1954 if assistance is needed to reach the evacuation hub. Evacuees will be transported to Belton, Texas.

Evacuees must bring driver's license or state-issued picture ID, medications for at least 10 days; toiletries, snacks, and 5 days worth of clothing; no more than two pieces of luggage, and one carry-on bag per person. Up to two non-aggressive (no reptiles), properly-crated household pets may be evacuated with the owner, who must supply current vaccination records, food, medicine, and water.

For critical information that needs to reach Pearland-area residents right away, the City will use the Connect CTY telephone notification system. Please note that residents MUST have a telephone 'landline' to receive automated messages without having to sign up. Otherwise, residents can sign up at www.cityofpearland.com to receive direct email, cell, and text alerts. Just select the 'City News' icon at the bottom of the home page.

Please call for any questions or for additional information.

The Federal Insurance Administration cautions everyone to double-check policies to make sure they're covered for flood damage. There is a 30-day waiting period before a flood insurance policy goes into effect. Home and content damage is not normally covered by a standard homeowner's insurance policy if the adjuster determines flooding caused the devastation.

are in place for the old police facility at 2703 Veterans Dr., which will eventually house several departments currently located at various other City facilities.

The move to roomier facilities more befitting of a city on the 'grow' - and designed to better serve the citizens of Pearland - has topped off an exciting year for the Pearland Police Dept., which celebrated its 50th anniversary in May - motivating overall changes in the "look" of the department.

In July 2009, the department unveiled a new patrol car design, which will be phased in as the patrol fleet is updated. The department's traditional patch-andeagle design was replaced by a "challenge coin" design that proudly displays the department's core values: INTEGRITY, PRIDE and HONOR. These values reflect the department's daily operations and decision-making process.

Next, the shoulder patch design was re-worked to more accurately depict the original intended design a pictorial emblem that tells Pearland's 'story'. Improved graphic technology now enables depiction of the true colors and realistic representations that were not possible in the late 1970's, when the patch was first introduced.

In addition to the new patrol car and shoulder patch designs, a redesigned commemorative badge was introduced April 2010. This badge includes the department's inception and anniversary dates, and reflects their state and national pride. The redesigned badge proudly retains the center seal from the previous badge to acknowledge the history of the city and department, as well as a five-pointed star in a starburst design symbolizing growth and expansion.

RECREATION CENTER AND NATATORIUM

Pearland's new Recreation Center and Natatorium is scheduled to open this August and the \$21.6 million facility aims to provide additional fitness and aquatic opportunities for both the Pearland community and surrounding cities alike.

The 107,000 square foot facility is a joint partnership with the Pearland Independent School District and the Pearland Economic Development Corporation. The center consists of a gymnasium, weight room, dance/aerobics room, racquetball courts, locker rooms and an elevated story indoor track. It also houses a multipurpose room, kitchen and a drop-in play area for children.

Inside the natatorium is a competition pool (50 meters x 25 yards), two 3-meter diving boards, two 1meter diving boards and a warm-up pool (25 yards wide by 4 lanes wide). The competition pool can be set in seven different configurations for recreational/lap swim, long and short course swim meets, water polo, competition diving and synchronized swimming. The warm-up pool is a shallow pool with a zero-depth entry. Primary uses for the warm-up pool include water exercise classes, swimming lessons and therapeutic recreation programs. The natatorium will also serve to both the Pearland High School swim and water polo teams.

In addition to memberships, the Recreation Center and Natatorium will also offer a host of themed birthday party packages which will be coordinated by a staff member. Theme examples include an "All About Sports" package, a "Princess Party", "Dora the Explorer" and many more. Party package pricing will range according to the number of attendees and will include goodie bags, cake, ice cream, drinks, plates, cutlery, cups and lots of fun activities. 

Area Projects Moving Forward

elow are current projects managed by the City. Please obey construction signs as they are placed for the safety of construction workers and citizens.

MCHARD ROAD – McHard Road from Country Place to Cullen extension continues. Crews are reconstructing existing roadway to include drainage improvements. Demolition of existing westbound lanes and pavement sub-grade preparation for the new lanes will be completed by early summer. Final completion including landscaping and traffic signals is scheduled for late 2010 or early 2011.

CULLEN PARKWAY – Construction is complete on the southbound lanes between the future McHard Road intersection and Broadway. Construction crews will begin removing the temporary pavement in preparation for new paving operations on the northbound lanes. Final completion is scheduled for this February 2011.

SH 35 ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS – TxDOT has awarded the construction contract for improvements along SH 35 from Beltway 8 to FM 518. The project includes widening the existing roadway from 4-lanes to 6-lanes with curb, gutter, raised medians, and decorative illumination lighting. The contract also includes the relocation of the City's water and sanitary sewers and the contractor will be installing a new waterline to service the residents and businesses in the area this summer. Citizens will continue to see the center lane closed as well as temporary lanes constructed to accommodate the construction. The project's duration is 44 months.

MAGNOLIA ROAD EXPANSION – Construction Phase Two, from Pearland Parkway across SH 35 to Veterans Drive is well underway. Crews are preparing to open the newly paved roadway and bridge in the early summer months. In Construction Phase III, citizens should be prepared for the widening of Cullen from Northfork to Southfork. Completion for Phase III is scheduled for February 2011.

DIXIE FARM ROAD – Crews have completed major paving operations on the northbound lanes. A traffic switch will occur allowing crews to begin paving the southbound lanes. Completion is scheduled for February 2011.

EAST MARY'S CREEK REGIONAL DETENTION – Crews are continuing to haul north along Mary's Creek, crossing Dixie Farm Road, entering the area of Pine Hollow Estates. Dirt will also be hauled south on Dixie Farm Road to two separate fill sites located off of SH 35.

UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON CLEAR LAKE – PEARLAND CAMPUS – Construction is nearing completion and will be open to UHCL students for the Fall 2010 semester.

ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER RENOVATIONS – Construction is nearing completion at the Pearland Animal Shelter to make desperately needed additions for Pearland's four-legged friends. Included in this renovation is the addition of twelve dog runs, four quarantine runs, a cat quarantine room and indoor utility area. The project is expected to be complete in the early summer months of 2010.

FIRE & EMS STATION NO. 5 – Construction of this new 10,000-sq/ft facility located at 3100 Kirby Drive has begun. The project includes nine dorm rooms, three and one-half truck bays, and landscaping around the facility. Consistent with City Council policy, this project will include a few "Green" standards.

Countertops will be compiled of recycled glass, some flooring will consist of recycled tires, and approximately 50% of interior materials will be regional (within a 500 mile radius). Estimated completion is January 2011.

RECREATION CENTER AND NATATORIUM - This newly constructed facility is 80% complete and in its final stages of construction. The facility is anticipated to open to the public at the beginning of August.

CITY OF HOUSTON INTERCONNECT – The City of Pearland has opened bids for the construction of a 30" waterline along Pearland Parkway from Fuqua to convey 10 million gallons per day of surface water from the City of Houston's Southeast Water Purification Plant. To accommodate the additional water supply, the City will make improvements to the existing Alice Street Water Treatment Plant. The project received a \$400,000 Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant for the purchase and installation of two turbines that are designed to convert the excess water pressure into electricity, supplying a portion of the electrical requirements at the pump station. Crews will begin construction in the early summer.

TOWN DITCH PHASE III – Improvements to the current Town Ditch will be made to allow adequate conveyance and outfall capacity to handle a 100 year flood event. The current ditch will be realigned between the BNSF Railroad right of way and Mykawa Road, including the installation of large box culverts in various locations. Crews will begin construction in the early summer months.

City Begins Voluntary Watering July 1

he City of Pearland plans to implement the annual voluntary watering schedule on July 1, 2010, per City of Pearland ordinances.

On the voluntary schedule, water customers are asked to begin outdoor watering at odd-numbered street addresses on odd dates of the month, and even-numbered street addresses water outdoors on even dates of the month. For example 3519 Liberty can water on any of the following days July 1, 3, 5, 7, etc.


Ideally, outdoor watering should occur between the hours of 6 a.m. to 10 a.m. or 8 p.m. to 10 p.m. Monday through Friday. Please be considerate of your neighbors and reduce or eliminate landscape watering on the weekends when demands on our water system are at the highest. High water usage can result in low water pressure. 
