FEMA or States on behalf of FEMA conduct Community Assistance Visits (CAVs) monitor community floodplain nanagement programs. A CAV is a scheduled visit to an NFIP community for the purpose of conducting a comprehensive assessment of the community's floodplain management program. The CAV is also used as an opportunity to provide technical assistance to the community. A CAV
