

## Proposition “A” - Drainage Improvements and Facilities

\$28,498,000



### Planned Projects

**Willowcrest Subdivision Drainage Improvements (\$15,926,000)** - Removal and replacement of storm sewer system, inlets and street reconstruction for the subdivision.

**West Lea Subdivision Drainage Improvements (\$5,492,000)** - removal/replacement of driveway culverts, opening covered ditches, widening and regrading of internal ditches and the ditch along 1128.

**Hickory Slough Detention Pond Ph II (\$4,239,000)** - Construction of the final phase of the detention pond including the final build out of the storm water lift station. The pond provides for a total of 95 acre feet of detention.

**Mimosa Acres Subdivision Drainage Improvements (\$1,690,000)** - Removal/replacement of driveways, driveway culverts, and ditch re-grading. Asphalt overlay of the roads due to drainage improvements.

**Piper Rd Drainage (\$1,151,000)** - Drainage improvements from FM 518 to Fite Road re-grading of ditches and culverts. Direct flows south to Mary’s Creek.

## Proposition “B” - Street Improvements

\$34,816,000



### Planned Projects

**Bailey Road Expansion (Veterans Dr to Main) (\$19,545,000)** - Extension of the final eastbound segment consisting of two lanes from Veterans over the railroad to Main to complete the four lane boulevard.

**Street Reconstruction Program (\$10,875,000)** - Reconstruction of eligible streets throughout the City as recommended by the Pavement Condition Assessment. Neighborhoods identified: Linwood Oak, Orange Circle, Sleepy Hollow, Sherwood.

**Pearland Pkwy Traffic Circle Improvements (\$3,272,000)** - Design and construct traffic control and safety improvements to the circular rotary to provide a more conventional geometry with a two lane roundabout with an outside by-pass lane. This will be vital with the extension of McHard road and the increased traffic volume that will result.

**Pearland Pkwy Traffic Improvements (\$1,124,000)** - Construction of a new traffic signal and intersection improvements at the intersection of Forest Park Lane/Summit Springs Lane to improve safety along that corridor.

Each proposition will be a separate item on the ballot that voters will be able to vote for or against. A vote for or against one proposition will not impact any other proposition on the ballot.

## Proposition “C” - Parks and Recreation Purposes \$2,500,000



**Park Equip Replacement Program (\$2,500,000)** - Programmatic replacement of park equipment over the next several years to maximize the lifespan of these amenities. Initial locations are South-down, Centennial, Independence Dog Park, Creekside Park, Aaron Pasternak Memorial Park, Corrigan, Zychlinski Park, and Woody Street Park.

## Proposition “D” - Animal Services and Adoption Shelter \$12,875,000



**Animal Services Shelter (\$12,875,000)** - Construction of a new animal shelter to meet the current and future needs of the community sized to provide shelter and adoption services for canines and felines, including State required quarantine areas, a veterinary services room and adoption services areas.

## Proposition “E” - Fire Department Training Burn Building \$1,300,000



**Fire Training Burn Building Ph I (\$1,300,000)** - Construction of a two-story live fire burn building to train fire fighter search and rescue skills and procedures for dealing with multi-story residential and commercial fire rescue operations. Building will include stairs, multiple room simulations, and sloped roof training.

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
