Highlights:

- Construction of the building pad(s) along with underground systems/sanitary lines for the concession stand and maintenance building have been completed
- Grading, lime stabilization and concrete placement is complete for the entire south parking lot to include electrical rough-in(s) for the light poles.
- Soil stabilization, and reinforced concrete slab-on-grade is complete for the Miracle Field artificial turf and shock pad placement.
- All primary construction activities, to include rebar, concrete placement and light pole stub outs, for the Northwest and Northeast parking lots are complete.
- All wood light-framing and exterior sheathing for the Concession Building is complete.
- The contractor will complete placement of all sidewalks around the multipurpose field by 23 April.
- Contractor is currently 70% complete with steel erection for the maintenance building.

During this phase of the project, there have been little (if any) impacts to schedule or production. On average the contractor has placed 520 CY of concrete for each parking lot placement without incident and communication within the construction team has been effective in resolving all utility conflicts. Other schedule impacts have been minor. The fence footings on the east side of the project, adjacent to Kingsley, have been shifted to inside of the sidewalk to avoid a gas line conflict in addition to small adjustments to the sidewalk on the south side due to the same gas line pre-existing location.

Due to the competitive pricing from Forney Construction on this project, City Parks and Recreation staff have brought forth the list of improvements for the contractor to provide a proposal to complete. The items were requests that were removed from the project due to opinion of probable costs that were evaluated during the design. The items were removed from the project prior to bidding to ensure the bids were within the proposed budget. Funding for the project is being reimbursed through an agreement with the Tax Incremental Reinvestment Zone (TIRZ) #2, legal counsel and TIRZ managers agree that the inclusion of the items requested by Parks are within the scope of the Letter of Finance Agreement. To fully use the capacity of the TIRZ funds allocated to park improvements staff will recommend Council award a change order to the contractor for this additional work in the amount of \$287,289.50. This equals 6.3% of the total contract of \$4,552,384.78. As with all expenditures on the project, the City is providing interim financing that will be reimburse by the TIRZ with interest. A breakdown is provided below.

Additionally, a scoreboard to be placed at the Miracle Field will be recommended for purchase through the BuyBoard coop at the May 10th, 2021 Council meeting. The Spectrum digital scoreboard proposal includes the visual and audio systems, framework design with engineered stamped drawings and installation for a total of \$129,766. Spectrum was selected to provide this amenity due to their longstanding relationship with the Miracle Field League and the competitive pricing received.

Scope: Phase II of the Sports Complex at Shadow Creek Ranch will include the addition of two cricket fields (which can also serve the needs of Rugby groups), a multipurpose 'Miracle Field' (adaptive multi-use field) area (a sports surface designed to accommodate special needs athletes), additional field lighting, approximately 250 parking spaces, and expanded restrooms and concession offerings.

Justification: As a growing cosmopolitan suburb, as defined in a recent APA publication, the diversity of our community is presenting an expanding need for diverse programming. In consideration of the field types mentioned it is critical to consider that the need and desire of, once niche sports, are now becoming staples of a culturally diverse population. The need for rugby and miracle fields are increasing due to the City of Houston acquiring a National Rugby Franchise, and the continued growth of quality of life for disabled populations due to proximity to the expanding Texas Medical Center, respectively. This project was submitted to the TIRZ #2 and was approved to receive funding.
